



TRANSFER CREDIT GUIDE: SOUTH CAROLINA COLLEGE OF PHARMACY (USC-COLUMBIA)

If you are a South Carolina technical college student who plans to transfer to the South Carolina College of Pharmacy at USC-Columbia to *pursue a degree in pharmacy*, you should consider the following courses as you schedule your technical college classes. The courses listed below will transfer to the degree program at USC-Columbia. This list does not include every technical college course which is available for transfer to USC. You are not required to take all courses listed prior to transferring. Rather, it is a guide for you and your advisors.* You should be aware that courses must be passed with a *grade of C or higher* in order to be considered for transfer credit. *You must have a GPA of 3.0 to be considered for admission*.
