



TRANSFER CREDIT GUIDE: ADVERTISING, PUBLIC RELATIONS, VISUAL COMMUNICATIONS

If you are a South Carolina technical college student who plans to transfer to the University's and *pursue a major in advertising, public relations, or visual communications*, you should consider the following courses as you schedule your technical college classes. The courses listed below will transfer to degree programs within the School of Journalism and Mass Communications. This list does not include every technical college course available for transfer to USC. You are not required to take all courses listed prior to transferring. Rather, it is a guide for you and your advisors.* You should be aware that courses must be passed with a *grade of C or higher* in order to be considered for transfer credit. *You must have a GPA of* 2.5 to be considered for admission. Technical College Courses

English:

- 1) ENG 101 and 102
- 2) ENG 203, 205, 206, 214, 218, or 222
- 3) Any other English literature

Humanities:

Three courses selected from the following:

a. SPC 205 (required of all majors) b. ART 101, 105, 107, 108; MUS 105;

b. ART 101, 105, 107, 108; MUS 105; THE 101; PHI 101, 110, 115, 201; REL 101, 102, 103, 201

Social Sciences:

- 1) HIS 101, 102, 104, 105,106, 108, 109, 110, 112, 115, 201, 202, 235
- 2) ECO 201 or ECO 210 and 211
- 3) ECO 201

Behavioral Sciences:

Three courses selected from the following: ANT 101; PSY 201, 203, 204, 205, 208, 212, 214, 215, 220, 225, 240; SOC 101, 102, 151, 205, 206, 210, 220, 235

Natural Sciences:

Two courses selected from the following areas:

- a. AST 101, 102
- b. BIO 101, 102, 105, 110, 112, 201, 202, 205, 207, 210, 211, 225
- c. CHM 101, 105, 106, 107, 110, 111, 112, 211, 212
- d. PHS 101, 102, 115

School of Journalism and Mass Communications Course Requirements

English (12 hours):

- 1) ENGL 101 and 102 (6 hours)
- 2) ENGL 282-289 (3 hours)
- 3) Another English literature (3 hours)

Humanities (9 hours):

Three courses selected from the following areas:

- a. SPCH 140 (required of all majors)
- b. Two Fine Arts courses selected from Art, Theatre, Philosophy, Religion, Music

Social Sciences (12-15 hours):

- 1) Two courses in history; one must be a non-US history (6 hours)
- 2) ECON 224 or ECON 222 *and* 221(3-6 hours)
- 3) ECON 224 (3 hours)

Behavioral Sciences (9 hours):

Three courses selected from the following areas:

- a. Anthropology
- b. Psychology
- c. Sociology

Natural Sciences (7-8 hours):

Two courses selected from the following areas (at least one must include a lab):

- a. Astronomy
- b. Biology
- c. Chemistry
- d. Physics

Analytical Reasoning:

Required: MAT 120

Choose one of the following options:

- a. MAT 130, or higher level calculus
- b. PHI 105 and 106
- c. CPT 101 and CPT 111 or 112 or 114 or 211 or 233
- d. MAT 165 or MAT 220

Foreign Languages:

FRE 101, 102

GER 101, 102

SPA 101, 102

School of Journalism and Mass Communications Course Requirements

Analytical Reasoning (6-9 hours):

Required: STAT 201

Choose one of the following options:

- a. MATH 122 or higher level calculus
- b. PHIL 110 and 111
- c. CSCE 101 and 102
- d. An additional STAT course

Foreign Languages (6 hours):

All students must demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to two semesters of the same foreign language. Students transferring credit equivalent to USC 109 and 110 have me the foreign language requirement for the School of Journalism and Mass Communications.
