Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How long does it take to complete the Bachelor Science in Criminal Justice?

A: Completion time varies based on already accumulated general education credits, and courses necessary to complete major concentration. The degree requires 120 credit hours. It is up to the student and advisor to decide the appropriate number of hours to take each semester.

Q: Is financial aid available? How much does the program cost?

A: Yes, students are eligible to receive applicable federal and state financial aid assistance. Current fees and tuition rates can be viewed at www.palmettocollege.sc.edu.

Q: Is the degree awarded by the University of South Carolina Upstate?

A: Yes, the degree is awarded by USC Upstate and meets the same rigorous standards and accreditation as any traditional degree from the University.

Prepare For Your Future

Businesses and organizations need employees who can write and speak clearly, manage and solve problems and function creatively and effectively in the real world. Your Criminal Justice degree will prepare you for success in these critical areas through an interdisciplinary, liberal arts program.

What can I do with a BS in Criminal Justice degree?

The Criminal Justice Program at the University of South Carolina Upstate is designed to provide present and future criminal justice professionals with the educational background necessary to be successful in a criminal justice career, graduate school or law school. Criminal Justice majors complete a course of study that includes the study of crime, offenders, courts, policing, corrections and victims. The program is concerned with both theory and practice.

Students will develop critical thinking skills, oral communication ability and writing proficiency in subjects related to crime and criminal justice. Through this interdisciplinary foundation, students will be prepared to serve South Carolina and beyond as future criminal justice professionals, scholars and informed

citizens. Criminal Justice graduates will have the conceptual knowledge and analytical skills to perform effectively and ethically in the field of criminal justice.

What does the BS in Criminal Justice degree not address?

This degree is not a police academy or a forensic science/crime scene investigation preparation program. Technical training and law enforcement certification are not provided. Students interested in forensic science/crime scene investigation should pursue a degree in the sciences (chemistry, biology or forensic science).

This degree is a liberal arts degree that provides an academic examination of crime and the criminal justice system.
